1. Do you have a personal connection with historic preservation?

I have a very personal connection with historic preservation. A few of my favorite places in Denver are Civic Center Park, Larimer Square, and the City Park Pavilion. These are sites that bring back family memories that are special to me and the historical building that show our rich history.

2. What is your favorite example in Denver (or in your district) where historic preservation, economic redevelopment and strategic reinvestment were successfully combined to create something new?

My favorite examples of historic preservation are Larimer Square and Union Station in addition to Red Rocks Amphitheater. The investment in preservation has directly influenced the successful economic vitality of these sites and show a balance of preservation, redevelopment and reinvestment that is vital to make sure you are creating something that is sustainable.

3. Neighborhoods across Denver are facing intense development pressure, and Denver's population is expected to increase in the decades to come. What specific ideas do you have to balance new infill with our historic built environment?

I would encourage ongoing dialogue and input from all interested stakeholders to move a development process forward that ensures the character of our neighborhoods is protected.

The District 11 neighborhoods of Montbello, Parkfield, Green Valley Ranch, and High Point are all relatively new neighborhoods with little or no opportunities for preservation. Challenges in District 11 center more on attainability/affordability issues rather than the challenges and opportunities for historic preservation.
